1. Cabinet okays Rs. 45,000 crore package to support exports, MSMEs amid global headwinds:

The government approved a ₹45,000 crore package to support exports struggling under the steep 50% US tariffs and sluggish global trade.

The package includes the much-awaited Export Promotion Mission (EPM), with an outlay of ₹25,060 crore, and ₹20,000 crore towards the Credit Guarantee Scheme for Exporters (CGSE). Export-oriented industries directly and indirectly employ over 45 million people, and MSMEs contribute nearly 45 per cent of India's total exports. The announcement came a week after the PM held meetings with the heads of at least half a dozen export promotion councils across sectors most affected by the steep, double-digit tariffs by the US.

2. India to be the world's largest driver of energy demand growth by 2035: IEA:

India has quietly pulled off a feat no other major economy has managed — hitting a 2030 energy target five years early. According to the *World Energy Outlook 2025* report released by the International Energy Agency (IEA), India reached 50 per cent of grid-connected power capacity from non-fossil sources in 2025, thanks to a surge in solar and wind investment that is transforming the country's energy system.

But the achievement is only part of a larger story. The IEA called India “the largest source of energy demand growth in the world” through 2035, as the country's economic and demographic rise reshapes global energy flows.

3. India's used car market hits 5.9 million units as SUVs, premium models fuel growth:

India's pre-owned car market touched 5.9 million units in FY2024-25 and is projected to grow at a 10 per cent compound annual growth rate (CAGR), reaching 9.5 million units by 2030, according to a report.

The 7th edition of the Indian Blue Book — the annual report developed by Car & Bike by Mahindra First Choice and Volkswagen Certified Pre-Owned — tracks buyer sentiment, market shifts, and technologies shaping the future of mobility.

India's top car makers Maruti Suzuki, Hyundai Motor India and Tata Motors, are gearing up to expand production by 20-40% in the coming months. The ramp up comes up after a sharp revival in vehicle demand following the recent GST cuts.

The government reaffirmed its commitment to a transparent, technology-driven, and worker-centric labour ecosystem in the country at a two-day National Conference of Labour & Employment. The two-day conference of industry ministers and secretaries of states and Union Territories, which was inaugurated by Union Minister for Labour & Employment Mansukh Mandaviya, concluded here.

The deliberations highlighted innovative measures and best practices aimed at fostering a more inclusive and dynamic labour market in line with India's economic growth trajectory, according to a labour ministry statement.

7. Bengaluru working women to get menstrual leave: Eligibility, number of leaves and all you need to know:

All working women aged 18-52 in permanent, contractual and outsourced jobs will get one day of menstrual leave per month, as per a Government Order passed on November 12. "Employers have been directed to provide 12 paid leaves per year to all women employees aged 18-52 in establishments coming under Factories Act, 1948, Karnataka Shops and Commercial Establishments Act, 1961, Plantation Workers Act, 1951, Beedi Cigar Workers (condition of employment) Act, 1966 and Motor Vehicle Workers Act, 1961," the order said.

India is preparing to ease rules for the import of certain types of speciality steel, most of which is not made in India or is produced in small quantities and used in cars, transformers and electrical equipment, two steel ministry officials said.

9. Karnataka targets expats in new IT policy amid global layoffs, aims to create 90 lakh jobs:

Karnataka will launch a programme for Indian tech expats returning home, which is among several initiatives under the new Information Technology (IT) Policy that aims to increase the state's software exports to Rs 11.5 lakh crore by 2030. The policy offers an 'IT Talent Return Programme' to support mid-career professionals overseas, which comes amid global layoffs and uncertainty looming over US work visas.

10. Govt's e-truck scheme set to hit the road as rare-earth norms eased:

India's push to electrify its heaviest freight movers is finally gathering pace. The Murugappa Group's electric truck arm IPLTech Electric Pvt. Ltd will shortly secure the localisation and homologation approvals from testing agencies under the Rs. 10,900 crore PM E-Drive scheme, as Tata Motors Ltd and Volvo Eicher Commercial Vehicles are slated to soon start testing their e-trucks, marking the next step for disbursements under India's marquee vehicle incentive scheme, people aware of the development said.

11. Why the IMF and World Bank are warning India about its financial regulations:

The quinquennial report cards on India's financial sector have been issued and they present a disturbing picture. The World Bank's Financial Sector Assessment and the International Monetary Fund's Financial System Stability Assessment were released during October and February, 2025, respectively. Both reports have pointed out critical, strategic gaps in the regulatory frameworks across the financial sector's different segments, thereby raising multiple red flags.

Union Steel and Heavy Industries Minister H D Kumaraswamy requested Union Commerce Minister Piyush Goyal to establish Industrial Parks across Karnataka.

Kumaraswamy, who met Goyal here, requested him to set up industrial parks in Mandya, Mysuru, Bidar, Raichur, Hubli-Dharwad, Mysuru, Hassan, Kolar, Mangaluru and Chamarajanagar. Kumaraswamy pointed out that the state has high potential to set up industrial parks in different districts as they have resource advantages, logistical strengths, and diverse economic profiles. "Kumaraswamy stressed that these regions collectively offer a strong case for large-scale industrial development and balanced regional growth".

13. India remains 2nd largest buyer of Russian oil with imports worth \$2.9 billion:

India has purchased crude oil worth \$2.9 billion from Moscow in October, ahead of the latest sanctions imposed on Russian entities, according to a European think tank. India continues to be the second-largest buyer of Russian fossil fuels in October, after China, the report said, citing the Centre for Research on Energy and Clean Air (CREA).

Conclusion:

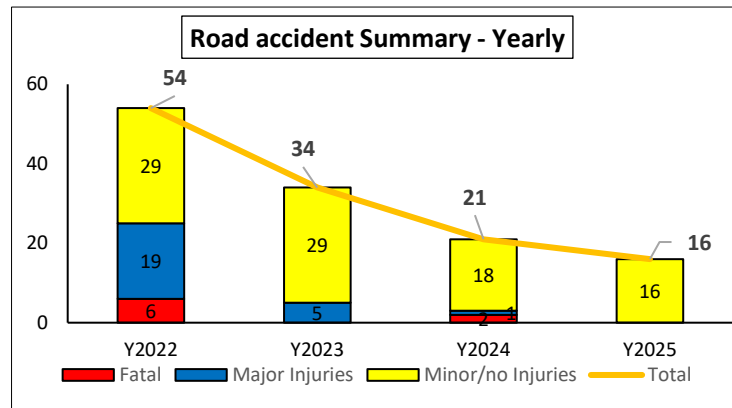
