Bidadi Industrial Area received SWACHH INDUSTRIAL PARK AWARD, 2025 (National award from FICCI).



Details of Award :

- At the advise and guidance of our Hon'ble Prime Minister Modi-ji, FICCI has initiated ranking of Industrial Parks in India, on various parameters, to promote the manufacturing and services sector, and recognising them at the national level.
- At its 2nd edition of giving away such Awards, FICCI had shortlisted **Bidadi industrial area** for **Swachh Industrial Park Awards, 2025**, in the '**Infrastructure Champion**' category.
- There were in total about 230 industrial parks from 18 states in India which contested, both from Govt. and Private sector, and Bidadi industrial area was shortlisted for the second level assessment.
- The second level assessment of Bidadi industrial area, through a team of independent jury members, took place in the month of August.
- On Friday, Nov 28, 2025, at FICCI's 98th Annual General Meeting, held at Bharat Mandapam, New Delhi, '**Bidadi Industrial Area, Karnataka**' was given the award **at the national level**.
- **Bidadi Industries Association, a private organisation**, is maintaining the Bidadi industrial area since 2016 alongwith it's other industry body functions. The Bidadi industrial area is developed by KIADB, a Govt. agency.

1. India allows a 100% foreign direct investment in insurance

The Union Cabinet approved a landmark bill raising the foreign direct investment (FDI) limit in insurance companies to 100%, along with structural reforms to strengthen the sector. The change is expected to attract significant foreign capital, increase competition, and enhance customer services in India's insurance market.

2. PLI for food processing industries generates about 3.39 lakh direct and indirect jobs

The production-linked incentive (PLI) scheme for food processing industries (PLISFPI) has generated about 3.39 lakh direct and indirect employment opportunities so far, the Parliament was informed.

Minister of State for Food Processing Industries, Ravneet Singh, said that 170 applications have been approved under various categories of the PLISFPI till September 2025.

3. India's cloud data centre capacity reaches 1,280 MW, to grow 4-5 times by 2030 : Jitin Prasada

Cloud data centre capacity in India has reached approximately 1,280 MW, largely serving critical sectors such as banking, power and other critical public infrastructure and according to industry estimates, it will grow by 4-5 times by 2030, the Parliament was informed.

4. India's auto sales hit highest November total as cars and two wheelers post new monthly records: SIAM

India's automobile industry continued its growth trend in November 2025, with sales across major segments rising year-on-year, according to monthly data released by the Society of Indian Automobile Manufacturers (SIAM). Passenger vehicle dispatches from companies to dealers increased 19% year-on-year in November as demand remained robust post the festive period, SIAM said.

5. Food inflation in negative zone for 6th month in a row

Retail food inflation in India remained in the negative zone (deflation) for the sixth consecutive month in November at -3.91% year-on-year, largely due to a high base effect and falling prices of vegetables and pulses. Retail food inflation remained in the negative zone for the sixth consecutive month in November when it came in at (-) 3.91%, largely driven by base effect and subdued prices of vegetables, cereals, pulses, meat, eggs and spices. However, it inched up sequentially from -5.02% in October, as prices of many food items firmed up.

6. RBI scraps plan to limit corporate current accounts to two big lenders

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) released the final guidelines on transaction account directions and introduced key relaxations while maintaining the overall principle-based framework. The draft norms, which were issued on October 1, covered transaction account operations across seven categories of regulated entities, including commercial banks, small finance banks, payments banks and co-operative banks.

7. India weighs tougher battery rules as 10GWh storage plan takes shape

More efficient batteries with longer life cycles could be mandated to address grid stability concerns under a scheme that offers incentives to produce 10 gigawatt hour of utility scale power storage.

“The ministry of new and renewable energy (MNRE) is likely to suggest two new elements of requirement. One is the criterion of round-trip efficiency to ensure that out of the energy infused in a battery, the maximum quantum is usable by the battery or grid operator,” said one of the two people quoted earlier. Round-trip efficiency is the percentage of usable energy consumed to charge the battery.

8. Agri-tech troubles: Why India's new e-NAM portal failed its Rajasthan pilot

The Centre’s plan to kickstart the second version of its ambitious electronic national agricultural market (e-NAM) is facing some glitches. Rajasthan has red flagging issues it faced in the pilot being carried out in the state.

According to sources, Rajasthan, in a series of letters sent to Centre in November, has cited difficulty in migrating data from the old platform to the new one, bringing trading at mandis back to manual. When the new module was launched in the state from November 4, the version of e-NAM stopped functioning. Rajasthan, along with Tamil Nadu, was selected for pilot projects.

9. Cabinet clears SHANTI bill to open nuclear power to private sector

Cabinet approved a bill that seeks to open the highly restricted nuclear power sector to private companies and is also crucial for the country’s goal of achieving 100 gigawatt nuclear power capacity by 2047.

10. Single higher education regulator closer as Cabinet okays Viksit Bharat Shiksha Adhikshan Bill

The Union Cabinet has approved the Viksit Bharat Shiksha Adhikshan Bill that proposes a unified regulator for higher education, replacing existing statutory bodies such as the University Grants Commission (UGC), the All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE) and the National Council for Teacher Education (NCTE).

11. India's forex reserves rise by \$1.03 billion to \$687.26 billion

India's foreign exchange reserves rose marginally, by \$1.033 billion in the week that ended December 5 to \$687.260 billion, driven by a jump in gold reserves, the Reserve Bank of India's latest 'Weekly Statistical Supplement' data showed.

12. Manufacturing to hit 25% of GDP as India builds towards \$25 trillion industrial vision: BCG Report

India is poised to become a global industrial powerhouse by 2047, with manufacturing's share of gross domestic product (GDP) targeted to rise from about 17 per cent now to roughly 25 per cent, a report showed on Thursday.

The report from Boston Consulting Group and Z47 identified electronics, defence, automotive and electric vehicles, energy and pharmaceuticals as five sectors that could anchor a \$25 trillion industrial opportunity by 2047.

13. India's drone, space-tech boom to add over 2 lakh jobs by 2033: Report

India's aerospace, drones and space tech industry is likely to expand more than five-fold to USD 44 billion by 2033, and is expected to create over 2 lakh new jobs for engineers, researchers, data scientists, among others, a report said. According to a report by workforce solutions provider Adecco India, the aerospace, drones, and space tech industry is rapidly evolving from a research-driven domain into a full-fledged industry, driven by government reforms, private-sector participation, and international collaborations. The country's drone and space-tech industry is expected to create over 2 lakh new jobs for engineers, researchers, data scientists, and business professionals, among others, the report added.

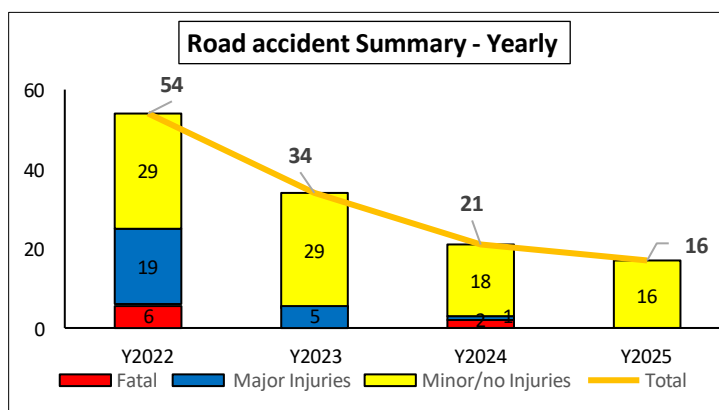

8. Providing uninterrupted power supply and services.
9. Providing skill development and training services.

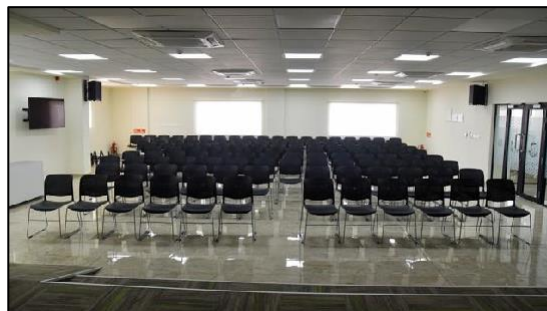

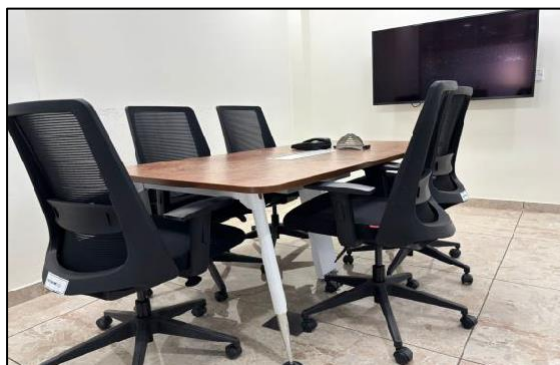
