1. India to become 3rd largest economy with \$7.3 Trillion GDP by 2030:

With GDP valued at \$4.18 trillion, India has surpassed Japan to become the world's fourth-largest economy and is poised to displace Germany from the third rank in the next 2.5 to 3 years with a projected GDP of \$7.3 trillion by 2030, an official statement said.

2. Labour Code draft rules clarify doubts, concerns still remain:

The notification of the draft rules for the four new Labour Codes unlocks the next and most important part of the reform process — how companies interpret them, according to domain experts. After the enforcement of the four new Labour Codes on November 21, the Labour Ministry pre-published the draft rules on Wednesday, following consultations with relevant stakeholders.

3. EPFO offices to undergo major changes, now functioning like passport service centres:

The government has taken a significant step to benefit Provident Fund (PF) account holders by transforming EPFO offices across the country into single-window service centers. This reform will make it much easier for employees to resolve PF-related issues.

Earlier, account holders were required to visit their specific regional EPFO office linked to their employer. Under the new system, PF members can now visit any EPFO office nationwide to get their issues resolved.

4. Real-time payments in 2025: How UPI's next phase is reshaping India's digital economy:

As UPI further expands into Credit-linked products (cards, limits, EMI), the growth potential is expected to skyrocket. The same holds for International Payments facilitated by UPI as well – given the explosion of QR codes globally, there is a lot of travel-related commerce that can be facilitated on the UPI rails. As transaction limits increase, B2B payments should also be able to find multiple use cases on the UPI rails.

5. Defence, Capital Goods to lead India's Capex Revival:

India's capital expenditure (capex) upcycle is showing early but credible signs of revival, and market strategists believe several investment-linked sectors are poised to benefit the most over the next two to three years. According to the India Equity Strategy 2026 by Antique Stock Broking, improving macros, policy support, and rising private and household investment are setting the stage for a broad-based capex recovery.

7. GST cuts boost credit growth: system credit to rise 12% in FY26, 13% in FY27: MoSL

Credit growth in the country is expected to remain at around 12 per cent year-on-year in FY26 and improve to nearly 13 per cent in FY27, while deposit growth is likely to stay steady at about 10 per cent year-on-year in FY26, according to a report.

8. Transport ministry proposes Aadhaar-like number to EV batteries for efficient traceability:

The Transport Ministry has proposed assigning Aadhaar-like unique identification number to EV batteries to ensure their end-to-end traceability and efficient recycling.

The proposed framework will make it mandatory for battery producers or importers to assign a 21-character Battery Pack Aadhaar Number (BPAN) to batteries, as per the draft guidelines issued by the Ministry. They will also have to upload the relevant Battery Pack Dynamic data on the official portal of BPAN.

9. Govt set to exhaust subsidy for bigger electric 3-wheelers three months early:

The Heavy Industries Ministry is likely to exhaust its Rs. 857 Crore subsidy fund for electric three wheelers in the L5 category under the Rs. 10,900 crore PM E-Drive scheme three months ahead of schedule, according to the Government's letter to manufacturers.

11. SPREE 2025 scheme deadline extended till Jan 31 to expand social security coverage:

The Employees' State Insurance Corporation, ESIC has extended the Scheme for Promotion of Registration of Employers and Employees, SPREE 2025 for a month to give more time to employers to join without past liabilities. Ministry of Labour and Employment said that the one-month extension reinforces ESIC's push for inclusive and simplified compliance, thereby expanding the social security coverage in the country.

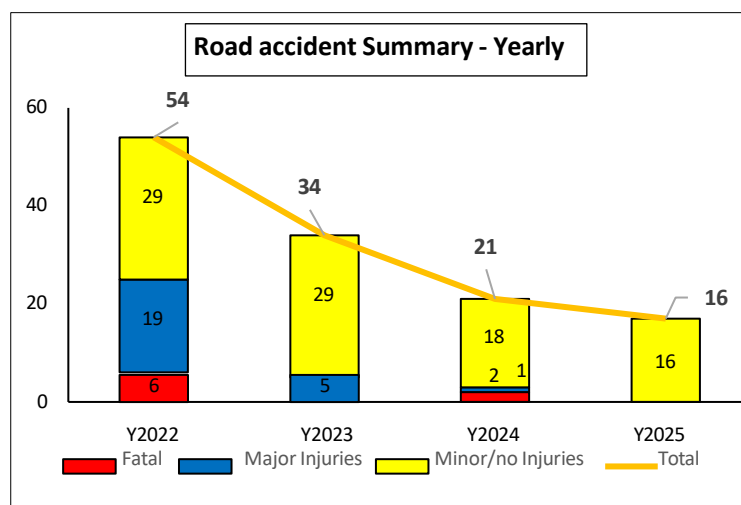

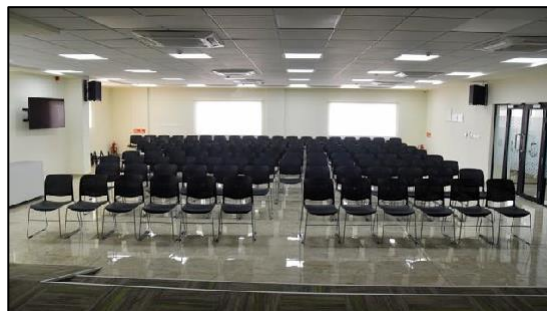

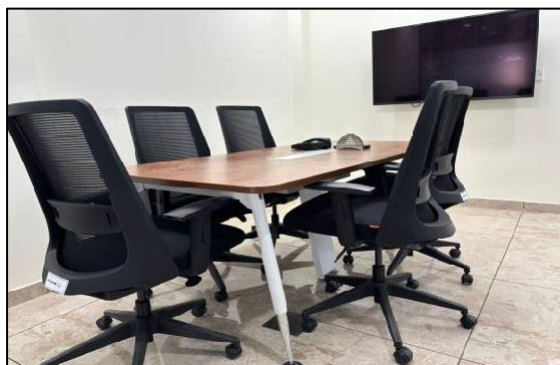
