1. India's growth to be 'north of 6.8%' : CEA Nageshwaran upbeat on FY26 outlook; cites boost from GST cuts and tax relief

Chief economic advisor V Anantha Nageswaran expressed confidence that India's economic growth for FY26 will exceed 6.8%, supported by stronger consumption driven by GST rate cuts and income tax relief.

Nageswaran said, "I am comfortable looking at a number north of 6.8 per cent now. My original range was 6.3 to 6.8 per cent (projected in Economic Survey). Back in August, we were all concerned about whether we would even go towards the lower end of the 6-7 range."

2. Indian economy more resilient and inclusive

The World Bank and IMF, in their latest Financial Sector Assessment Program (FSAP) reports on India, said the country's financial system has become more resilient, diversified, and inclusive since the previous assessment in 2017. The World Bank released its Financial Sector Assessment (FSA) report on Oct 30 while the IMF published its Financial System Stability Assessment (FSSA) in Feb 2025, following the joint evaluation conducted in 2024.

3. Karnataka cabinet clears Rs. 518 crore startup policy to boost emerging tech

The state cabinet approved the Startup Policy 2025-2030, a five year plan with an outlay of Rs. 518 crores aimed at creating 25,000 new startups, including 10,000 in clusters beyond Bengaluru.

4. PM Modi rolls out Rs. 1 Trillion RDI Fund for 'high risk, high impact projects'

Prime Minister Narendra Modi unveiled a ₹1 trillion research, development and innovation (RDI) fund aimed at spurring private sector-led research and technological advancement across the country.

The announcement was made at the inauguration of the Emerging Science, Technology and Innovation Conclave (ESTIC) 2025, marking one of the government's major steps to institutionalise innovation financing.

The Department of Science and Technology (DST) will serve as the nodal ministry for the fund, which will operate through a two-tiered structure.

5. Karnataka releases a new Skill Development Policy; to train 3 million youth by 2033

Chief Minister Siddaramaiah on Tuesday unveiled Karnataka's new Skill Development Policy 2025–32, here. Speaking at the inaugural ceremony of the Bengaluru Skill Summit, the Chief Minister said the policy came with a seven year strategic blue print, backed by a robust outlay of Rs. 4,132 crores.

10. Indian carmakers on alert after Nexperia crisis triggers global chip crunch

A battle for control of a little-known chipmaker has threatened global auto production by choking off the semiconductor supply chain, though there are signs the crisis is inching toward a resolution.

The power struggle over Nexperia, a Chinese-owned Dutch semiconductor maker, highlights how technology supply chain vulnerabilities are squeezing auto makers, most notably forcing Honda to halt production at a Mexican factory making its popular HR-V crossover for North American markets. It also exposes how Europe is caught in the middle of the wider geopolitical showdown between Washington and Beijing. Nexperia makes simple semiconductors such as switches and logic chips. The auto industry - one of Nexperia's biggest markets - uses its chips for numerous functions, such as adaptive LED headlight controllers, electric vehicle battery management systems, and anti-lock brakes.

The Centre is reworking the Sagarmala 2.0 initiative into a 10-year Rs. 75,000 crore programme aimed at developing India into a global maritime hub with world class ports and ship building infrastructure, two persons aware of the matter said.

15. India's air travel market is experiencing turbulence. Why?

After years of steady ascent, a sudden turbulence has caught India's air travel industry unawares. For three months in a row, the number of passengers flying in the country has shown a decline.

That is no good news for the world's third biggest aviation market in general, and in particular, to its marquee airlines who have placed orders for new aircraft—IndiGo alone has a backlog of nearly 1,000 planes with Airbus.

As per DGCA figures, domestic air traffic declined a sizeable 2.9 per cent in July, then again, a drop of 1.4 per cent in August and further fell 2.9 per cent in September.

To put it more succinctly, year-on-year growth, which was as high as 12 per cent in the first half of this year, has now dropped to as low as 1.9 per cent by the second half of the year.

Meeting with District Police – Update on Industrial Area Traffic Management – Gemba with Police on 17.10.2025



1. Purpose of Visit:

To review traffic congestion issues in the industrial area and discuss actions for smooth traffic flow.

2. Discussion at BIA Office:

CEO explained the main causes of congestion and requested consistent “No Parking” enforcement by the police.

3. Site Visit:

Police officials visited Kadumane and Byramangala Junctions to see congestion points and understand ground issues.

4. Traffic Signal Action Points:

ASP confirmed that signal operations will start soon. Police suggested minor civil and electrical changes, which will be implemented by BIA for the police

5. No Parking Enforcement:

One Sub-Inspector will be deployed in the industrial area for regular “No Parking” enforcement and penalties.

6. Peak-Hour Traffic Management:

Police communication through BIA asking industries to restrict container movement during peak hours. They are also exploring the option of deploying Home Guards to assist during busy periods.

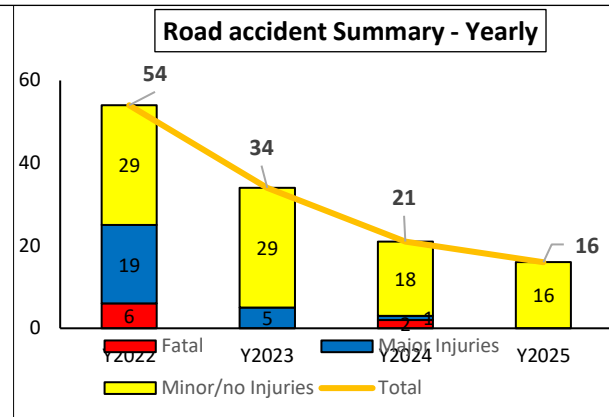
The Programme focused on enhancing awareness among industries about sustainable manufacturing practices, quality improvement, and productivity enhancement under the MSME initiatives.

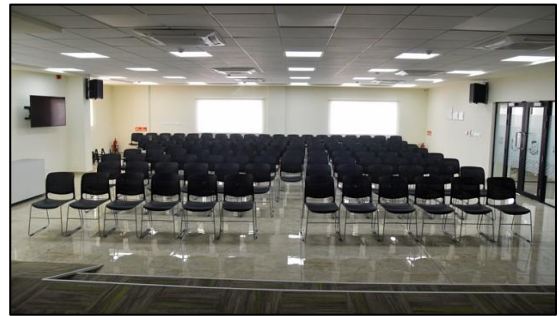
