2. Draft labour policy unites social security schemes

Universal and portable social security is a major component of the draft National Labour and Employment Policy, which proposes to create a universal account by integrating the Employees Provident Fund Organisation, Employees State Insurance Corporation, Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana, e-SHRAM, and the State welfare boards. The draft policy, known as the Shram Shakti Niti 2025, was released for public consultation.

3. Govt to launch Rs. 7,350 Cr plan to boost production of rare earth magnets

The government is in final stages of launching a ₹7,350 crore scheme to spur domestic production of sintered rare earth permanent magnets (REPMs) and cut import dependence, Business Standard has learnt. This comes months after China imposed restrictions on exports of REPMs in April, squeezing supplies to India's automobile and electronics industries.

4. Karnataka approves 12 menstrual leaves a year across sectors

Karnataka cabinet, chaired by CM Siddaramaiah, approved a policy granting one paid menstrual leave every month (12 in a year) to women employees across all sectors – including government offices, garment factories, IT firms, MNCs and private industrial units. This initiative is expected to benefit over 50 lakh women in the state, and the policy is likely to be notified soon.

5. PM-SETU: Rs. 60,000 Cr scheme to upgrade industrial training institutes.

Special purpose vehicles with credible anchor industry partners will be set up under the Rs 60,000-crore PM-SETU scheme to manage clusters and ensure outcome-based training, the Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship said.

6. PM Modi rolls out over Rs. 35,000 crore agri schemes, urges farmers to look at global markets

Underlining that fortunes of millions of farmers will be transformed, PM Narendra Modi launched two new agriculture schemes, the PM Dhan Dhaanya Krishi Yojana (PMDDKY) and the Mission for Aatmanirbharta in Pulses, with a total outlay of `35,440 crore.

7. Govt. tightens norms for hazardous chemicals, paint ingredients

The Government has overhauled more than four-decade old safety codes that govern the production, handling and storage of hazardous chemicals, as it seeks to strengthen industrial safety and prevent chemical related tragedies in the country.

As part of the revamp, the Bureau of Indian Standards (BIS) has introduced new national norms covering benzene, toluene, xylene, chlorine tablets, and radiological monitoring.

8. Govt proposes Electricity Bill 2025 to fix tariffs, ease industrial rates

In a major step towards power-sector reforms, the government has proposed amendments to the Electricity Act that would make cost-reflective tariffs mandatory, rationalise high industrial rates, and exempt railway systems and manufacturing companies from the burden of cross-subsidies.

9. Big boost for agritech: India opens doors to more farm subsidies

Agritech startups, farmer producer organisations, and other private companies looking to tap the government's marquee agriculture incentive scheme will likely benefit as a key eligibility is set to be relaxed.

The Union Government plans to lower the minimum number of farmers required per project so more companies can qualify for subsidies or incentives under the government's Public-Private partnership for Integrated Agricultural Value Chain Development (PPPAVCD) scheme.

10. India's auto battle: Foreign carmakers launch new offensive

Mass market automakers including Skoda-Volkswagen, Honda cars, Renault and Nissan plan to launch more than a dozen new models over the next two years. Cumulatively, these four brands have only 5% share of the passenger vehicle market in India as of August, 2025.

13. MSMEs contribute 40% to India's production, exports : Shobha Karandlaje

Union Minister of State for Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises Shobha Karandlaje said the MSME sector is contributing 40 per cent to the country's total production volume and exports.

"The role of industries in the country's development is significant, especially, MSMEs are making substantial contribution to the nation's growth," she said.

In order to strengthen the sector, the government led by Prime Minister Narendra Modi started the Skill Training Division for the first time. It has been undertaking training programmes and schemes for women and youth to match the global skill standards, she was quoted as saying in an official statement.

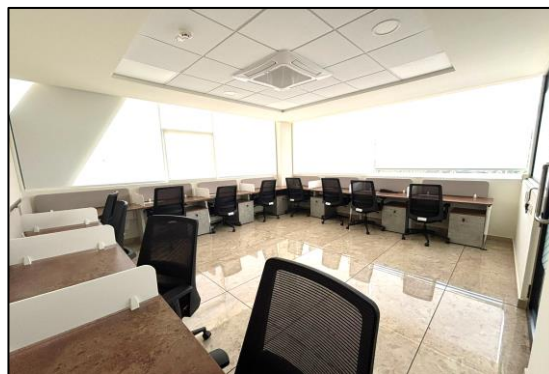
