1. FDI inflows surge \$51 billion in 6 months as Government pushes manufacturing, startups collaboration:

India has received foreign direct investment (FDI) worth USD 51 billion in the last six months, reflecting sustained global confidence in the country's growth story, Amardeep Singh Bhatia, Secretary, Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade (DPIIT) said. He said, "As part of its startup push, DPIIT will organise National Startup Day on January 16, during which 75 Grand Challenges will be launched to foster innovation and problem-solving across sectors."

3. April to December 2025: India's exports cross \$634 Billion on non-oil strength

India's cumulative exports of merchandise and services during April–December 2025 are estimated at \$ 634 billion, marking a 4.33 per cent increase over the \$ 608 billion recorded in the corresponding period last year.

The growth reflects a gradual but steady recovery in external demand amid a challenging global trade environment. While merchandise trade deficit during April-December 2025 was \$ 248.32 billion as compared to \$ 223.96 billion last year.

6. India's real GDP growth to be in 6-7% range in FY27, Capex to grow by 14% : Report

India's real GDP growth in FY27 is expected to be in the range of 6–7 per cent, supported by domestic consumption, interest rate cuts, and public capital expenditure, according to a new report. For budgetary analysis, ICRA used the NSO's 'First Advance Estimates' of nominal GDP of Rs 357.1 trillion for FY26, reflecting a growth of 8.0 per cent, and its own estimate of Rs 392.0 trillion for FY27, implying nominal GDP growth of around 9.8 per cent.

7. Electronics manufacturing leads PLI scheme as production jumps 146%: Report

Electronics manufacturing, especially of mobile phones, has emerged as a standout performer, in the Performance Linked Incentive (PLI) scheme, with production rising 146% from Rs 2.13 lakh crore in the Financial Year 2021 to Rs 5.45 lakh crore in Financial Year 2025, as per the data shared by the CareEdge Ratings.

8. Exports rise 1.87% to \$38.5 billion in December

The country's merchandise exports rose 1.87% to \$38.5 billion in December 2025, Commerce Secretary Rajesh Agrawal said. Imports increased to \$63.55 billion in December 2025 from \$58.43 billion a year ago. The trade deficit stood at \$25 billion during the month under review. Despite global uncertainties, India's exports are recording positive growth, Mr. Agrawal said.

Two-wheeler sales in India crossed the two-crore mark in 2025, rising about 5% from around 1.9 crore units in 2024, even as volumes remained below the record peak of 2.1 crore units sold in 2018, according to the data released by the Society of Indian Automobile Manufacturers.

15. PF benefits for more people, EPFO to increase wage limit soon

The Supreme Court has asked the central government to increase the current wage ceiling under the Employees' Provident Fund (EPF) scheme in four months, as per a report from Press Trust of India (PTI). The wage ceiling is the statutory maximum limit for mandatory contributions to Employees' Provident Fund (EPF) and Employees' Pension Scheme (EPS). This limit has not been increased from September 2014, even though salaries and inflation have increased significantly.

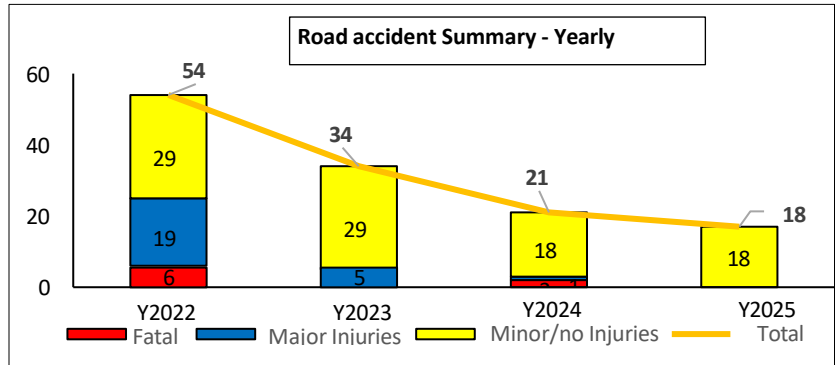
