1. Labour reforms: Govt. fully operationalises four new codes by publishing rules:

After a long wait of over five years, the central government has fully operationalised the four labour codes by publishing rules, ensuring minimum wage and universal social security for all workers. The four codes, namely the Code on Wages, 2019, the Industrial Relations Code, 2020, the Code on Social Security, 2020, and the Occupational Safety, Health and Working Conditions Code, 2020, came into effect from November 21, 2025.

2. India leads in global remittance inflows as overseas workforces and student migration grow:

India remained the world's largest recipient of remittances in 2024 with inflows reaching \$138 billion, according to the World Migration Report 2026 released by the International Organization for Migration.

The report said India was the only country to cross the \$100-billion remittance mark, highlighting the economic contribution of its global diaspora estimated at around 19 million people.

3. Banks see strong credit growth: RBI data reveals 10% deposit jump:

Banks' credit growth gathered pace in the fortnight ending April 30 at 16% while deposits grew 12.3% year-on-year, Reserve Bank of India data showed. The year-on-year credit growth was recorded at 15% a fortnight back while deposit growth print was at 12.2%.

4. Private capex jumps 67% to Rs 7.7L cr in Sept '25:

India's private sector capital expenditure rose 67 per cent to Rs 7.7 lakh crore in September 2025 from Rs 4.6 lakh crore a year ago, CII said, as it unveiled a five-point industry action agenda amid the West Asia crisis and beyond, comprising a phased drawdown of the central excise cut on petrol and diesel.

With India signing a series of free trade agreements with developed countries, the government is working on an FTA utilisation plan to help maximise benefits from these pacts, an official said. Since 2021, India has finalised free trade agreements (FTAs) with Mauritius, Australia, the UAE, Oman, New Zealand, the EFTA (European Free Trade Association), the European Union (EU), the U.K. and U.S.

6. Air India delays Bengaluru MRO facility amid domestic supplier failures:

Air India has pushed the start of its maintenance, repair and overhaul (MRO) facility at Kempegowda International Airport in Bengaluru by at least a year to January-March 2027, as construction remains unfinished, according to three people familiar with the matter. The airline's inability to source construction materials including steel and bolts from domestic manufacturers is the key reason for the delay.

7. Construction equipment sector to grow 7% in FY27 : ICEMA:

The domestic construction equipment industry is expected to return to growth in FY27 after a weak FY26, with the industry body Indian Construction Equipment Manufacturers Association (ICEMA) projecting around 7% growth next year. The recovery is expected to be driven by higher government spending on infrastructure, improving road construction activity, and increased allocation for rural projects, Deepak Shetty, President, ICEMA said.

8. Hantavirus : India activates precautionary surveillance measures:

In a recent update, India's Union Health Ministry has activated precautionary surveillance measures after reported cases of hantavirus infection aboard the expedition cruise vessel MV Hondius. As per official information shared through the World Health Organisation (WHO) under the International Health Regulations (IHR) framework, there are eight probable cases reported onboard the ship so far. Among these, five are laboratory confirmed infections and three deaths.

9. India lays out plan to protect hospitals from fire accidents:

In a significant move to strengthen patient safety and hospital preparedness, the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare has launched a nationwide Fire Safety Week across healthcare facilities. The initiative comes at a time when concerns over hospital infrastructure safety and emergency readiness are growing, particularly after repeated reports of fire incidents and compliance gaps in medical institutions.

10. E-truck localization: What do new norms mean for the industry?

On 29 April, the Centre issued guidelines requiring electric truck makers to localize components such as battery management systems and vehicle control units to qualify for incentives under the PM E-Drive scheme. E-truck makers must use domestically produced components from September 2026. The government had eased rules during the 2025 rare-earth magnet shortage by extending deadlines for importing related subassemblies without forfeiting incentives. The rationale behind the policy directive. Trucks account for a small (3%) share of India's total vehicles but contribute about a third of the country's road sector greenhouse gas emissions, making the shift towards electric trucking important.

11. Oil-marketing companies incurring ₹30,000 crore loss per month on petrol, diesel and LPG:

India's oil-marketing companies are incurring losses of about ₹30,000 crore every month on the sale of petrol, diesel and liquified petroleum gas (LPG) as they hold steady retail fuel prices amidst elevating prices of crude oil, informed Sujata Sharma, Joint-Secretary at the Union Petroleum Ministry.

12. India may not sign FTAs, to opt for deeper ties with customs unions in Africa, say officials:

India will not attempt signing free trade agreements (FTA) with the African continent 'as of now', and will instead prioritise commercial ties with the trading blocs and customs unions in the continent, said officials here on Saturday (May 9, 2026). The information was shared by officials as preparations are under way for the upcoming India-Africa Forum Summit (IAFS-IV), where a number of African heads of state and heads of government are expected to attend.

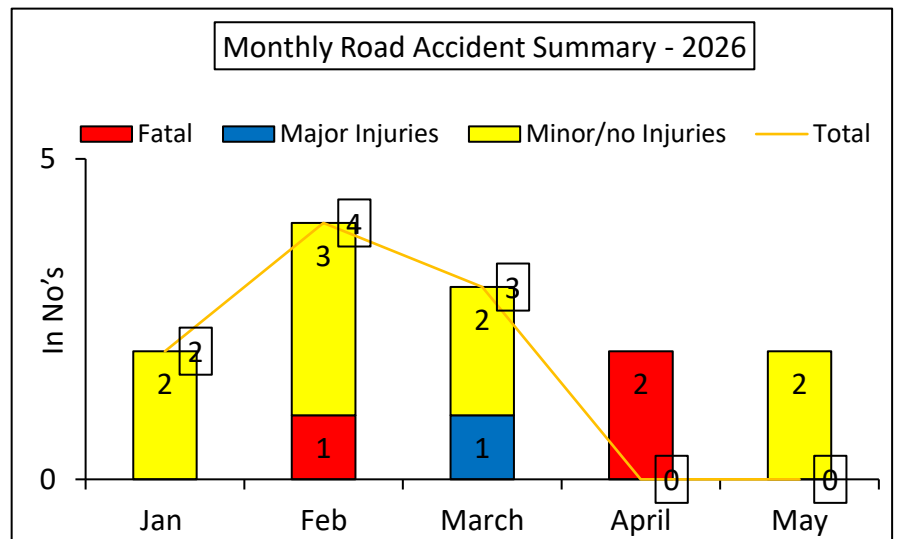

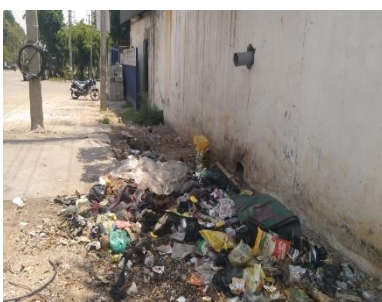

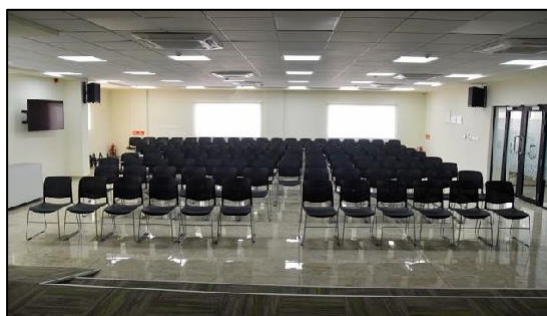
