1. **Karnataka Govt hikes minimum wages of labourers by 60% :**

The Karnataka government increased minimum wages for workers by 60 per cent, with labourers in Bengaluru now set to receive a minimum monthly wage of Rs 23,376 under the revised structure. Announcing the decision, Labour Minister Santosh Lad said the move would strengthen economic security for workers and fulfil a long-pending demand of the labouring community across the state.

2. **India manufacturing likely slowed in May amid Iran war, services resilient:**

India's private sector growth eased in May as a manufacturing slowdown driven by the Middle East war and cooling international demand offset a marginal pick-up in the service economy, a survey showed. May's deceleration was primarily centred in manufacturing, where new orders expanded at one of the slowest rates in nearly four years and production growth eased to its second-weakest level since mid-2022. The factory PMI dropped to 54.3 in May from April's 54.7.

With petrol crossing Rs 97 in Delhi and Rs 106 in Mumbai overnight, India's office commute has quietly become one of its most expensive daily habits. As fuel prices hit fresh highs, Prime Minister Narendra Modi's appeal for work-from-home, hybrid jobs and public transport isn't just sound advice — it's urgent arithmetic.

4. **India's policymakers are staring at a set of gloomy trade-offs:**

The high price of oil has exposed its vulnerability, with the reverberations of every policy action or non-action likely to influence other parts of the economy. Let's start with monetary policy first. The regime of low interest rates is over and the decision that India's central bank must take is when—and by how much—to raise its repo rate. The Goldilocks scenario has turned into a Cinderella syndrome, where all base effects turn negative and inflation pushes aggressively upwards. This is a global phenomenon. Last year, India managed to counter the US tariff blitzkrieg well. But this year's oil crisis differs; it resembles episodes of the 1970s when the shock was felt across almost every sphere.

5. **RBI transfers record ₹2.87 trillion dividend to Centre, raises risk buffer**

India's central bank will transfer a record 2.87 trillion rupees (\$29.99 billion) to the federal government for the last fiscal, it said on Friday, undershooting market expectations for a larger dividend that would have helped New Delhi at a time when its finances are strained by the Iran war-led energy shock. The surplus is higher than last fiscal year's 2.69 trillion rupees, which was also a record high. A Reuters poll of economists had pegged the surplus in a range of 2.9 trillion rupees to 3.2 trillion rupees.

6. FSSAI plans centralized food surveillance system, reducing state officers' role:

The Centre is planning a regulatory overhaul to centralise states' role in food surveillance sampling under the country's apex food regulator – the Food Safety Standard Authority of India (FSSAI), according to two government officials familiar with the matter. Currently, state level food safety officers handle both surveillance sampling and enforcement sampling.

7. Centre launches Bhavya scheme to set up 100 industrial parks across country:

Union Commerce Minister Piyush Goyal announced the launch of guidelines for the 'BHAVYA (Bharat Audyogik Vikas Yojna) Scheme', under which the Centre plans to develop 100 industrial parks across the country. At a press briefing, Goyal said the scheme will have a financial outlay of ₹33,660 crore and aims to create manufacturing and investment hubs through plug-and-play industrial parks in partnership with state governments.

8. India's exports rise 13.8% in April; FDI hits record \$95 billion : Goyal

The country's exports have recorded healthy growth during the first three weeks of May, Commerce and Industry Minister Piyush Goyal said. He also said that while the world is going through a turmoil, India is relentlessly rising on global stage as it is recording health growth in exports and foreign direct investment (FDI). "I have seen the numbers of exports even in the last three weeks. The pace of growth which we witnessed in April continues into May. We have been able to demonstrate resilience in the face of so many adversities," he told reporters here.

GIFT City is India's first operational smart city and International Financial Services Centre (IFSC) located in Gujarat capital Gandhinagar.

11. 31 states yet to notify state rules under new labour codes:

While the centre has notified rules under the new labour codes, the state governments have been slow to respond. Only three states, Bihar, Arunachal Pradesh and Gujarat, have notified the final rules under the four Labour Codes. Tamil Nadu has published three of the rules and has not yet announced the fourth labour code regarding social security. West Bengal has not yet published draft rules. The State Rules under the new Labour Codes are yet to be notified in 31 states.

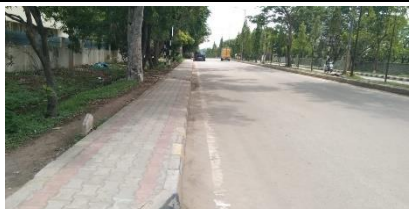
12. EPF withdrawals via UPI likely soon: How members can transfer funds directly to bank accounts in 3 easy steps

The Employees' Provident Fund Organisation (EPFO) subscribers may soon have the option of withdrawing their provident fund directly via the Unified Payment interface (UPI), since the government has finished testing this new feature. The minister announced that the testing phase for the UPI-based EPF withdrawals has been completed successfully. Once launched, EPFO members will be able to transfer their eligible EPF funds directly into their bank accounts via the UPI payment gateway.

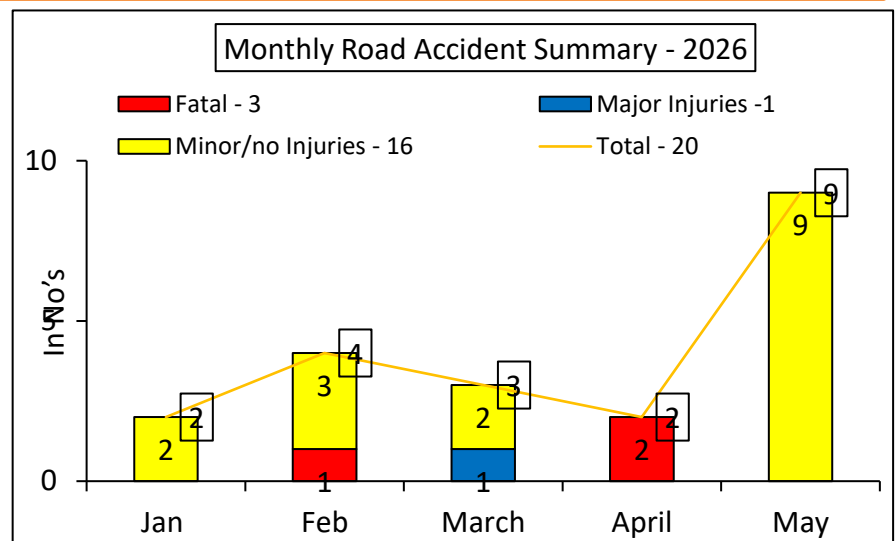

Subject: Road safety Guidelines and Appeal to follow Traffic Rules in and around Bidadi industrial area.

Greetings from Bidadi Industries Association!

It has been observed that road accidents in and around the Bidadi industrial area have increased in recent days, causing concern for the safety and well-being of employees, workers, staff members, and the community members.

Safety is a shared responsibility, and every organization has an important role in promoting safe practices both inside the workplace and while commuting on public roads. In this regard, we request all member industries to strengthen awareness; and provide regular safety training sessions for employees and contract workers, stakeholders on road safety practices and responsible driving behaviour.

We kindly request all member industries to refresh, educate and encourage employees, stakeholders to strictly follow the below Golden rules / Guidelines of road safety:

1. **Mandatory use of helmets**
 - Ensure that all employees and riders wear helmets at all times while riding two-wheelers.
 - Helmets must be properly fastened with the chin strap for effective protection.
2. **Avoid use of mobile phones while driving or walking**
 - Strictly discourage the use of mobile phones while riding, driving, or walking on roads.
 - Mobile distractions significantly increase the risk of accidents.
3. **Seat belt compliance**
 - Ensure that all occupants in vehicles wear seat belts without exception.
 - Fastening of seat belts applies to both drivers and passengers.
4. **No over speeding**
 - Emphasize on strict adherence to speed limits within and around the industrial area.
 - Over speeding endangers not only the driver, but also pedestrians and other road users.
5. **Follow traffic rules and signals**
 - Encourage employees to obey all traffic rules, road signs, and signals at all times.
 - Avoid wrong-side driving and unsafe overtaking.
6. **Safe movement inside industrial premises**
 - Maintain proper vehicle movement discipline within factory premises.
 - Ensure designated parking areas and pedestrian pathways are followed.
7. **Awareness and training programs**
 - Conduct regular safety awareness sessions related to road safety, defensive driving, and emergency response.
 - Display safety posters and awareness messages at prominent locations within the company premises.

We, sincerely request all member industries to consider road safety as a priority; and extend full cooperation in creating a safer industrial environment for all.

Let us work together to reduce accidents and promote a culture of safety and responsibility in and around Bidadi industrial area. Our goal is ZERO ACCIDENT.

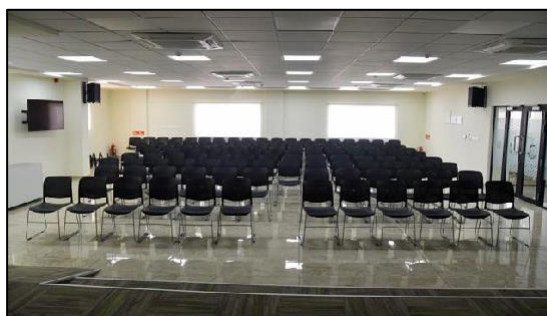
