1. India's startup ecosystem generated nearly 25 lakh jobs over last decade: Union minister Dr Jitendra Singh

Union Minister of State for Science and Technology Dr Jitendra Singh said India's startup ecosystem can sustain its growth only through continuous research, innovation, industry partnerships and entrepreneurship, as he inaugurated the RISE Conclave 2026 in Bengaluru. Singh said India has witnessed remarkable growth in the startup sector since the launch of the Startup India initiative in 2015. From around 350-400 startups a decade ago, the country now has more than 2.3 lakh startups, generating nearly 25 lakh jobs and making India the world's third-largest startup ecosystem.

The Karnataka High Court on June 9 allowed several interlocutory applications filed by various workers' associations seeking impleadment as parties to a plea challenging State government's May 22 notification proposing minimum wage hike for 81 scheduled employments.

3. India's May retail inflation surges for 3.93%; economists see further upside risks

India's retail inflation inched up to 3.93 percent in May compared to 3.48 percent in the preceding month due to higher food prices, according to official data. Consumer Price Index-based inflation in the food basket was 4.78 percent in May, higher from 4.2 percent in April, according to the National Statistical Office (NSO) data. As per the data, the precious metal jewellery, tomato, ginger, raisin (kishmish), and monacca were the five items with the highest inflation.

6. India eyes Rs.50,000 crore defence exports by FY30; ramps up next gen tech push with drones and AI.

India's defence exports are on track to surpass the government's Rs 50,000 crore target before 2029. Speaking at an investor interaction meet, former DRDO chairman Dr Samir V Kamat said that India's defence exports currently stand at around Rs 38,000 crore and are expected to grow rapidly in the coming years. "Indigenous system procurement has risen to 70% and imports have fallen to 30%. Over the next five years, indigenous procurement is expected to reach 80-85%," Kamat said.

7. India remains net importer of steel for second straight month in FY27

India remained a net importer of finished steel for the second consecutive month of FY27, according to provisional steel ministry data, as the ongoing Iran war reshapes global demand patterns.

Finished steel imports rose 62.5% year-on-year to 0.689 million tonnes (mt) in May, while exports increased 29.9% to 0.508 mt, widening the trade deficit in finished steel.

8. MNCs turn to tax treaties to settle cross-border disputes faster

India's top law firms are seeing a significant rise in mandates from multinational companies (MNCs) seeking to resolve cross-border tax disputes through the mutual agreement procedure (MAP), a treaty-based dispute resolution mechanism, as businesses increasingly turn away from lengthy litigation in favour of negotiated settlements. Unlike conventional litigation before tribunals and courts, the process relies on negotiations between competent authorities of treaty partners.

10. US court rules Trump's \$100,000 H-1B visa fee as 'unlawful': What comes next?...

The Trump administration said it will appeal a federal judge's ruling striking down President Donald Trump's \$100,000 fee on H-1B visa applications in its effort to hike the fee by tens of thousands of dollars.

The Justice Department filed the notice three days after U.S. District Judge Leo Sorokin in Boston vacated the fee, ruling that Trump exceeded his authority by imposing what amounted to a tax without approval from Congress.

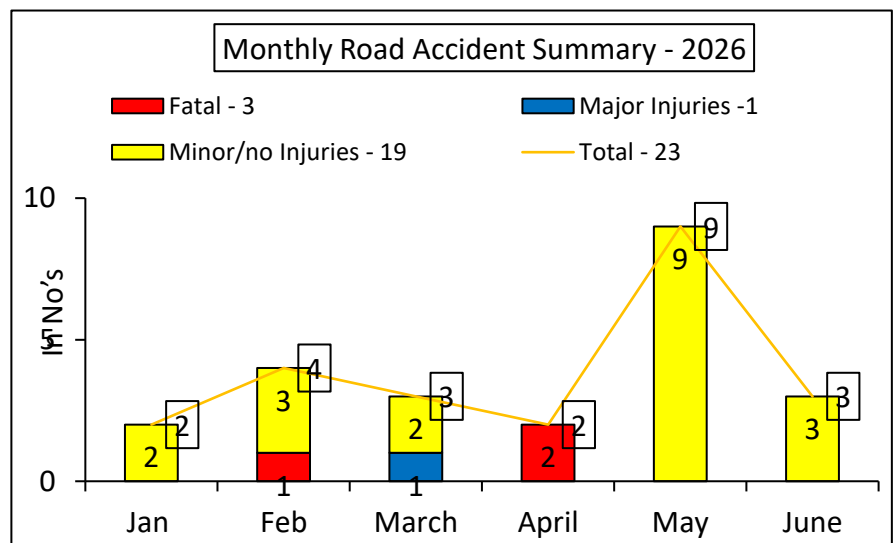

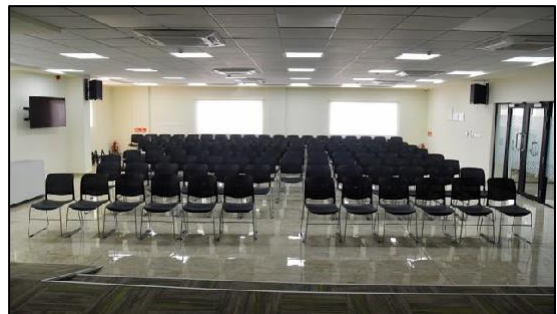
