1. Karnataka weights new framework to boost start up participation in public projects

Karnataka is considering a new framework that could enable the government to become an early adopter of startup solutions, helping it bridge one of the biggest challenges young companies face; access to government procurement.

The proposal, currently under consideration, seeks to create pathways for start-ups with proven solutions in governance, citizen services and public administration to secure their first deployment with the government, according to N. Manjula, Secretary, Department of Electronics, IT, Biotechnology, and Science & Technology, Government of Karnataka

2. India's real GDP growth likely at 6.6 pc in FY27

India's real gross domestic product growth will touch 6.6 per cent in FY27 amid energy stress, a sub-par monsoon outlook and slowing global growth, a report said.

The report from S&P Global Ratings said consumer inflation in India is expected to rise to 5.1 per cent this fiscal year as manufacturers pass higher energy costs to consumers. alongside recent increases in administered prices for petrol, diesel and cooking gas.

3. Beyond SEZs, companies want more industrial parks

The debate over Karnataka's proposed AI City in Bidadi extends far beyond a single 9,000-acre project. It raises a larger question about the future of industrial development in India: are traditional Special Economic Zones (SEZs) and industrial parks gradually giving way to integrated economic cities? The answer, increasingly, appears to be yes.

Karnataka alone has unveiled three large integrated developments in recent months — a 9,000-acre AI City at Bidadi, the 5,800-acre KWIN City and the 1,000-acre SWIFT City — collectively spanning nearly 16,000 acres. Similar models have already emerged elsewhere, from Gujarat's GIFT City and Dholera to integrated economic zones in China, Vietnam, the UAE and Saudi Arabia, where governments are packaging industry with housing, schools, hospitals and commercial districts instead of offering standalone industrial estates.

4. India's formal job market diversifies beyond traditional sectors : Report

Hiring across India's formal economy is diversifying beyond traditional white-collar sectors such as technology, with consumer facing and service industries driving some of the strongest recent gains. The report by indeed highlighted that job postings in India remained 3.4 percent higher year on year in May but eased 0.7 percent on a monthly basis.

5. Foreign investors pour Rs. 35,000 crore in Indian bonds after govt. tax exemption move

Foreign portfolio investors put in around Rs 35,000 crore so far this month in Indian bonds after the government exempted them from income tax on interest income and capital gains arising from investments in these bonds, according to Clearing Corporation of India Ltd (CCIL) data. All these investments came under the Fully Accessible Route (FAR) of Indian government securities. This is because FAR allows non-resident investors to invest in specified Government of India-dated securities without any investment ceilings, as per data.

6. India-Japan relationship could become world's most important : Japanese Finance Minister

Japan's Finance Minister Satsuki Katayama believes the India-Japan relationship could become the world's most important. Speaking at a Tokyo conclave, she lauded PM Modi and emphasized cooperation between nations sharing common values. The event highlighted significant Japanese investment and business presence in India, with Maruti-Suzuki's record production underscoring the economic synergy.

7. DBT saves Centre Rs. 5.14 lakh crore in a decade

The transfer of subsidies and welfare benefits through the Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT) system helped the government plug leakages worth Rs 83,064 crore in FY25, taking the Centre's cumulative savings via this route to Rs 5.14 lakh crore, according to the latest government data. These savings have given government finance managers greater fiscal space to improve expenditure quality and extend additional welfare benefits to eligible beneficiaries without placing undue pressure on the exchequer.

8. Government restores commercial LPG supply to pre-war levels

Extending major relief to commercial and industrial LPG consumers, government removed all sectoral restrictions on the supply of non-domestic packed liquefied petroleum gas and restored supplies to the levels prevailing before the West Asia conflict began. Govt. has also relaxed the supply of bulk LPG, which had been suspended at the onset of the crisis, to 50% of pre-crisis consumption levels.

9. India's engineering exports hit record \$12.31 billion in May despite Iran war

India's engineering goods exports rose to a record high of \$12.31 billion in May 2026, marking the highest-ever monthly exports for the sector despite geopolitical tensions in West Asia and the trade disruptions arising from the conflict, according to data released by EEPC India. Engineering exports grew 24.48 per cent year-on-year from \$9.89 billion in May 2025, with the sector accounting for 27.2 per cent of India's total merchandise exports during the month, based on the government's quick estimates.

11. India plans semiconductor buildout with ₹7,100 crore incentives in FY27

India is stepping up its bid to build a domestic semiconductor supply chain, with the Centre planning to disburse 7,100 crore in incentives this fiscal year under a fresh set of project targets spanning chip fabrication, manufacturing and design, according to two government officials aware of the development. The government expects the funding to attract about Rs. 15,000 crore in fresh investment and generate around 4,700 jobs.

12. India set to become world's No. 2 solar market; total capacity crosses 150 GW.

India is set to become the world's second-largest solar market in 2026 as the country emerges as one of the fastest-growing solar power markets globally, with cumulative installed solar capacity crossing 150 GW in March 2026. According to technology and analytics firm Rubix Data Sciences, India improved its global ranking from ninth place in 2015 to third place in cumulative installed solar capacity by 2025. The sector has seen some near term challenges such as a steep tariff barrier from the US, India's largest export market for solar modules, along with lower domestic demand compared to India's manufacturing capacity and an increased dependence on China for photovoltaic (PV) cell imports. Despite these challenges, Rubix remains confident about the sector.

13. Ethanol blending programme safe, use of E20 won't affect vehicle insurance validity : Govt.

India's ethanol blending programme remains safe, consumer-friendly, and economically beneficial, the government said, dismissing concerns that the use of E20 fuel could affect the validity of vehicle insurance policies. The oil ministry in a statement said claims linking E20 fuel use to insurance invalidation had been clarified with relevant stakeholders and were found to be incorrect.

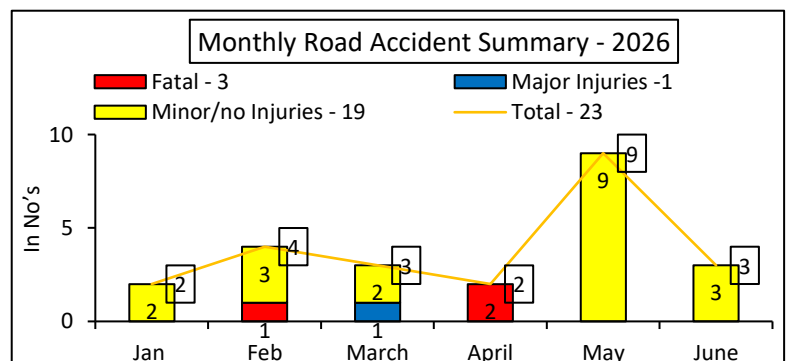

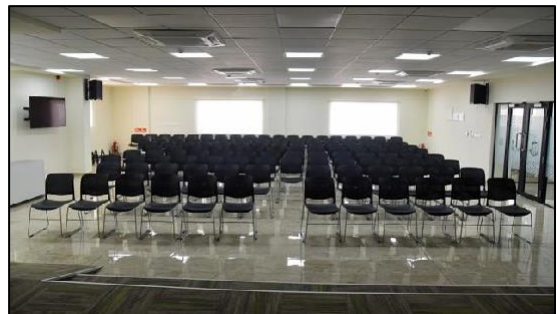
